Secretary report:

Treasurer's report:

Teacher Allotments funds that remain from 2021-2022 school year. One idea is to roll over to the next year.

Discussion:

Question: Do teachers spend over the summer?

Answer: Yes. Save receipts. Ashley will continue with another spreadsheet to track each teachers funds.

Audit of Treasury:

Audit is to check that finances are going proper.

Answer: Yes. They may see something that's overlooked; give pointer; tips to improve/adjust.

Question: Would an audit cost?

Answer: Yes.

Comment: Maybe there is a parent or local business that deals with accounting or banking that could volunteer services.

Old Business:

Fun Run raised approx \$5,000 We will know final amount upon check from company.

Silent Auction raised \$2,600

Question: How does the profit compare to the Spring Carnival & Silent Auction.

Answer: Between the Baskets and Carnival was around \$5,000 That's after all expenses.

New Board will have to make decisions to present the Spring Fundraiser to the main PTO in Aug.

Floor open for comments:

Comment: In years past with the carnival, teachers had to help with the carnival to receive allotments. Maybe need to see about assignment for teacher.

Comment: Kent Bohling was the Fundraiser contact.

Comment: They had a Color Run at 80% profit, 20% expense. Suggested we look for a smaller % of expense.

Comment: More games for ALL ages.

Comment: Fun Run flyer made them think "What! Another fundraiser."

Too close to Heart Assoc. fundraiser.

Comment: Carnival doesn't feel like a Fundraiser for the family. They get more of an experience.

Comment: Carnival has felt too crowded. Fun Run wasn't as inclusive to community.

Comment: Look into a larger location to host the carnival.

Comment: poor advertising for all ages. Seemed advertised for only CES kids.

Food Trucks:

Comment: Resounding GOOD!

Question: Did the food truck/vendors give a percent to PTO.

Answer: No. The committee contacted about 20 vendors. By the time 3 businesses agreed to attend, they didn't push the issue. They kindly let them know they could give a percent if they would like to do so. Some want to come back next year.

Parent Comments:

Motion made for Rylee Schlesener to purchase a Shamrock wood sign like the one in the Silent Auction from Board and Brush in Wichita for \$70. Then staff can sign names. 1 st by Lori Strauss. 2nd by Cole Krinhop. Verbal vote. Motion passed.

Bylaws — Lindsey shared that the committee that was formed this year had only met once. The piece the bylaws together method made her nervous. Suggests for the next year we as a PTO adopt or revise a National PTO bylaws or find a standard copy of bylaws.

Comment: Google Simple bylaws for parent use.

Question: What can we do to get more parents at PTO meetings/involved?

Comment: Plan meetings when parents will be at the building. Example: Kindergarten circus

Comment: Get more information out to parents.

Comment: After seeing a parent, they just asked them why they didn't help with PTO.

Replies from parents — 1. Time issues 2. "Yes" committee. Didn't feel their voice was heard. Seems to just be extra hands.

Comment: Previous parents were nervous to attend, they didn't want pushed into a role/task.

Question: Has there been parents as classroom representatives to PTO?

Comment: A parent may feel more present to attend if they know they are responsible for a full classroom. Maybe even have 2 parents per, so they could alternate attending.

Comment: Glad to see the meeting be in person.

2022-2023 FALL Teacher Allotment:

What is a teacher allotment? The handbook states the Full time classroom teachers (meaning those who have the same students all day: Pre-K through 5th) receive \$250 for supplies needed for their classroom. The Specialty teachers (meaning those who rotate students all day: Music, P.E., Title I, Special Education, Speech) receive \$200 for supplies needed for their room.

\$250 x 16 teachers = \$4,000

\$200 x 6 teachers = \$1,200 for a total of \$5,200

Discussion:

Question: Do we want to go back to cash allotments? Vs. this year's receipt method.

Answer: If are doing the audit, we will need receipts.

Question: What if we purchase something from Facebook marketplace or a garage sale, those don't have a receipt?

Comment: Photo screen shot. Ask the seller to sign a paper stating the item and sale price.

Any way you can document.
